Kit Activities

The following activities are designed to give parents, teachers, and caregivers a starting point to teach children the importance of kindness and inclusion in a global world. Be the catalyst that helps the children in our community develop positive attitudes toward others regardless of background and become global and kind citizens. Incorporate diverse literature in your everyday routine, rather than making diversity a one-time lesson. Use teachable moments to discuss the concepts of equity, diversity, and inclusion.

Equity - the quality of being fair and impartial.

Diversity - a range of people with various racial, ethnic, socioeconomic, and cultural backgrounds and various lifestyles, experience, and interests.

Inclusion - the practice of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized.

Activity one: Read and Sing

Read *In My Anaan'a Amautik* by Nadia Sammurtok with your child. Talk about the book: What is an amautik? How did the baby feel being in anaana's amautik? Now sing *If You Are Happy And You Know It*, and encourage your child to make the hand motions as you sing!

Activity two: Hurtful Words

Have your child draw and cut out a big heart, then read with them *The Proudest Blue* by Ibtihaj Muhammad. Talk about the beautiful blue hijab that Asiya wears to school. Have your child crumble the heart every time one of Asiya's classmates says or does something hurtful. At the end of the story have your child attempt to smooth out the heart. Even though the heart appears smooth, the cruel words have left marks. Use this story to address hurtful language.

Activity three: Fishing with Grandma

In *Fishing with Grandma* by Susan Avinqaq, the children ask Anaanatsiaq if they can go on an adventure. What happens on the adventure? What do they do with their extra Arctic Char? With your child, surprise someone from your neighborhood with a special treat!

Activity Four: Create a Family

Families come in all shapes, forms and sizes. Use the action figures to talk about the different make-ups of families around the globe.

Kit Activities

Activity Five: Globe Trekking

Begin by reading the book *This is How We Do It* by Matt Lamothe. Use a globe or map to look up the countries highlighted in the book. Then find a country on the globe or map and research it together in the book!

Activity Six: Pretend Meal

Begin by Reading *Food Like Mine* by DK Publishing to your child. Next, prepare a pretend play meal together. Talk about your favorite foods from other cultures.

Activity Seven: Build a Puzzle

Together work on the *Melissa and Doug Children of* the World Puzzle! Now look at the wonderfully diverse clothing, flags, and traditions of other countries!

Activity Eight: Awesome Alaskan Adenture

Watch Molly of Denali: Molly's Awesome Alaskan Adventure together. Ask your child, "What are some of the most memorable Alaskan adventures you have had?". Now each draw a picture that illustrates this adventure. Where did the adventure take place? What people would be in the picture?

Activity Nine: Listen and Dance

Together listen to *Best Multicultural Songs For Kids* and watch videos of musical celebrations around the world. Start and stop the music to have a Freeze Dance competition!
