




#### **CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING**

When conditions are right, the Kenai Parks & Recreation Department offers cross-country skiing at the Kenai Golf Course. Optimum conditions include 8"-10" of snow in order for the course to be groomed.

#### TRAIL DESCRIPTION

The Kenai Nordic Trail System is suitable for a beginner, yet challenging enough for an experienced skier. The terrain is predominantly flat with a variety of landscapes such as hills and passages through trees, which are incorporated into the design. The scenic views are beautiful, particularly at sunset.



#### TRAIL ETIQUETTE

- Please respect private property of local neighbors.
- Grooming equipment has the right of way. Please move well off the trail to allow equipment to pass safely
- No pets, fat bikes, running, walking or sledding on trails.
- Skijoring is allowed. Please keep skijoring dogs on leash at all
- Use caution, moose and other wildlife are common. Keep a safe distance at all times.
- When approaching a slower skier with intent to pass, shout "track" well in advance to alert the skier. The slower skier should step to the side.
- If you fall, please get clear of the trail and mend any damage to trail. Do not obstruct trail or visibility.

## TRAIL GROOMING SCHEDULE

The SKIKENAL Trail Report and information is posted regularly to our Kenai Parks & Recreation Facebook page. Trails are groomed as conditions and resources allow, generally 2-3 times a week. You are also welcome to call our office at 907-283-8261 and inquire about specific trail conditions.

The following factors influence the grooming schedule:

- HIGH WINDS
- HEAVY SNOWFALL
- HEAVY RAINFALL
- INSUFFICIENT SNOW
- STAFF RESOURCES

The department utilizes both a Ski-doo Skandic Widetrack and an Arctic Cat Bearcat, which includes a roller/compactor, a compaction drag, a small renovator and a 84" YTS Ginzugroomer with tracksetter to maintain our Nordic trails.



#### OTHER WINTER ACTIVITIES

- \* Outdoor Ice Skating. Conditions permitting, ice skating is provided at Daubenspeck Family Park (400 Marathon Rd). Always check ice thickness before venturing onto ice. For more information, call the Kenai Parks & Recreation office at 283-8261.
- \* Indoor Ice Skating. Ice skating is available under a covered shelter at the City of Kenai Multi-Purpose Facility located at 9775 Kenai Spur Highway. Public Skate available Monday-Sunday 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm. Skate rental is available on site.
- Winter light display at Leif Hanson Memorial Park
- \* Pedestrian Trails (hiking, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing), Access to Ryan's Creek (Kili Betnu), Trails from Main Street Loop, Granite Point Street or Airport Way. This trail system follows a heavily wooded stretch of Ryan's Creek located in the heart of Kenai. The total distance is 1.3 miles.





#### SKI RENTAL AND PURCHASE

There are local businesses on the Kenai Peninsula that either sell or rent ski equipment. For more information contact the Parks & Recreation office at 283-8261.
