CITY OF KENAI PUBLIC NOTICE SNOW REMOVAL

In order to maintain the road width, snow must be pushed or blown back away from the edge of the road to make room to store snow from future snowfalls. The standard right-of-way in the City of Kenai is 60 feet with the actual property line 10 to 20 feet behind the edge of the road.

The City of Kenai requests that all stakes, rebar, posts, or other items be removed from the road right-of-way. Such items could accidentally be caught up in the snowblower and become a projected missile causing damage or injury. Posts bent over during snow removal could be dangerous to snowmobilers and others. Basketball hoops, vehicles, campers, trash containers, ornamental rocks, planters, retaining walls, or other items should be removed. Items in the ROW that are damaged or cause injury are the responsibility of the property owner.

The City understands the owners' concerns over the area between their property lines and the actual road. The City appreciates the landscaping that is done in this area and regrets any damage we cause in plowing snow. The City will make any repairs to lawns in this area with topsoil and seeding.

When there is a snowfall of more than 6 inches or if the snow is heavy and wet, some snow will go around the gates and be left in driveways. Removing this snow will be the owner's responsibility.
