



Know your Neighbor: Yen-ti Verg-in By: Barb Christian

No doubt you know Yen-ti or have seen her around the Kenai Senior Center and Vintage Pointe. But you had to look fast! Not only is she a small lady, but she 's usually on the move toward one of her many roles. If you manage to catch her, you'll enjoy her friendliness and her sense of humor.

During the years she and her husband Ray have lived in Vintage Point and enjoyed the Senior Center, Yen-ti has immersed herself in the life-and the work-of the place.



She has helped people at the busy front desk, and she is on the Senior Connection board. She supports other writers as a member of the Senior Center's Writer's Group, where she shares her own honest and often funny experiences. Long a resident of Alaska villages and other far-flung points, she writes clever, "we -learned-from-this" tales about her boating and fishing exploits, her kitchen experiments, and her interactions with her husband and two adopted Alaska Native sons. Readers of Centerline will recognize her byline.

Yen-ti joins other Senior Center activities such as bingo, where she has been a caller, and the choir. She has been seen delivering trays at lunch-or even creating part of the lunch. For this year's Chinese New Year, she and Xiaopei LaTocha prepared Chinese delicacies for a large (and eager) crowd. The scent and sizzle of her spring rolls and other dishes waft from her apartment when she decides to treat her many friends. One resident tells about Yen-ti preparing food for her and her sons as she was moving into Vintage Pointe. Another story shows her serving soup out in the cold with other members of the Kenai United Methodist church during the winter of COVID.

Though she would never tell you, Yen-ti holds a Master's Degree from the University of Oregon. She's more likely to tell you that in her early years she was an uninspired student who frustrated her parents. She caught fire later on, especially in mathematics, and she shared this talent with students in numerous parts of Alaska and in Micronesia. She and Ray started teaching in the Yukon Delta in 1970, eventually spending fifteen years in Pitka's Point, Marshall, and Russian Mission, where they came to appreciate the villagers, lived the village life, and tackled the art of fishing the river. In 1974 and 1976, during their seven years at Marshall, they adopted two Alaska Native boys. The family later moved to Sitka, where Yen-ti launched the study of Pacific Rim cultures and the Chinese language at Mt. Edgecumbe. After three years there, they moved to Sand Point on the Aleutians, where they taught and fished the ocean for ten years, retired from teaching, and spent another twenty fishing during the summers. No wonder Yen-ti can rock a kuspuk!

After retiring from teaching in Alaska, Yen-ti and Ray opted for the opposite experience of the tropics, teaching on Pohnpei, a small Federal island the States in of Micronesia—just 7 degrees above the equator, and a bit closer to Yen-ti's birthplace. She was born in China, and her family later moved to Taiwan. Her stories of her time there present a whole new aspect of her life growing up, learning her role in

the family and society, and studying among the Catholic nuns at Providence College in Taiwan.

On Pohnpei, Yen-ti and Ray learned a new culture and a new approach to the ocean. Ask Yen-ti sometime about landing the jobs and about her efforts to dive for dinner like the locals. By the way, she can rock a muu-muu, too.

The years since Yen-ti and Ray returned to Alaska have taken their toll, and Yen-ti now devotes most of her time to caring for her lifetime partner. You'll still find her around Vintage Pointe and the Senior Center, though. Catch her, and you may be lucky enough to discover one of the many lives she has lived and which she recounts with honesty and humor.

December 1-7 is National Handwashing Awareness Week!

December is a very busy month with family gatherings and potlucks. It is also cold and flu season.

Keeping your hands clean at these meals is the best way to protect yourself and your loved ones from getting sick.

When to wash your hands:

- ✓ Before and after eating
- Before and after touching your eyes, mouth, or nose
- ✓ Before cooking or preparing foods
- ✓ After using the toilet or changing a diaper
- ✓ After coughing, sneezing, or blowing your nose
- ✓ After handling garbage
- \checkmark Anytime your hands are visibly soiled



Family meals are a great time to connect and make fun memories with your family. However, it can also be an easy way to spread germs when sharing food utensils at the dinner table. Washing hands often (or using hand sanitizer) when serving food will help reduce the spread of germs. This can be especially important for Elders, small children, or others with an immune system that might not be as strong.

How to wash your hands correctly:

- 1. Wet your hands under running water
- 2. Lather your hands with soap, making sure to get between your fingers, under your nails, and the back of your hands
- 3. Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds
- 4. Rinse your hands under running water
- 5. Dry your hands with a clean towel or air dryer
- 6. When you don't have access to soap and water, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol to kill any germs. Make sure to cover the entire surface of your hands and fingers until your hands feel dry, about 20 seconds.

The 4 Principles of Hand Awareness:

- 1. Wash your hands when they are dirty and before eating.
- 2. DO NOT cough into your hands.
- 3. DO NOT sneeze into your hands.
- 4. Above all, DO NOT put your fingers into your eyes, nose, or mouth.
