Know your Neighbor: Denny Thomas

Meet Denny Thomas, born in Fontana, CA. on Dec. 28, 1948 and his wife Mary Anaruk-Thomas, born in Kasigluk-Bethel, AK. Denny has 2 sisters and one brother and Mary has 2 sisters and one brother. Together they have 8 children, 27 grandchildren, and 28 great grandchildren.

Denny moved to Alaska in 2009 and says he met Mary on line. He said he is the 1st one in his family to move to Alaska. He and Mary have been married for 11 years and needless to say they each have an extensive history before they married but what I want to tell you is about their current passion.

Denny is an Associate Pastor at the Mt. Redoubt Church in Nikiski, but he and Mary joined a FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Disaster Relief Organization. There are 10 members of the Alaska group that Denny is a Director for the Kenai Peninsula. Their mission is clean-up and restoration of private homes that have been hit with a Natural Disaster anywhere in the world. They just returned from an assignment in North Carolina on the Hurricane Helena.

His team went in with chainsaws and doze tree and brush removal, mold and mud removal from basements, and drywall removal for those families that needed help. The major part of their task though is to minister the Gospel and reassure those families that God has not forgotten them, and that He will help them through. Denny says that is where Mary came in. He could do the hard work and she could deliver the message of "Hope" to them.

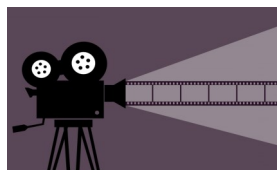

Virginia Passes the Library Torch

Kari lives in Vintage Pointe, holds a masters in library science degree and was the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's Media Coordinator for nearly twenty years.

Books: Each section has been put in alphabetical order by the author's last name. We have three new sections: Fiction, Prehistoric Fiction, and Science Fiction. Romance, Alaska, Adventure, Mystery and Westerns have their own sections. Louis L'Amour books (Westerns) are located in the Computer Room on the cabinet shelf.

DVD's: The DVD's are in alphabetical order by title. Titles that had been in the collection for a long time were culled in order to make room for new donations. The Blu-Ray titles are located in the shelves under the television as are some boxed DVD series.

Puzzles: The jig-saw puzzles have been grouped by the number of pieces in the box. There are marked sections for 300, 500, 550, 750 and 1,000 with a few oversized puzzle boxes grouped together. The 1,000 piece puzzles are on the top shelf. Often the puzzles within each section, are grouped by the manufacturer so it is easy to spot and rehome duplicates.

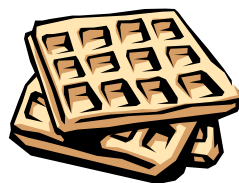
