Know your Neighbor: Janice Wilsack

"I've had such a blessed, life," said Janice Wilsack. "There's nothing really fancy or

outstanding, I've just had a wonderful life."

Janice was born in Anchorage in 1942 and has lived in Alaska for all of these years. "I was so blessed with such wonderful, hard working parents. They taught us how to be very good Christians and hardworking people."

When Janice was seven years old, the family moved to Nikiski where her dad had purchased a fish site ten miles north of Kenai. "There weren't any roads, so we had to take a fish tender from a cannery in Anchorage to Daubenspeck's Cannery in Kenai. We had to wait for the tide to go out so we could drive the Jeep up to the fish site. Because we only had the Jeep it took many, many runs."

After working the fish site, Janice's father took the family to work at a lodge at the end of Iliamna Lake on the Kvichak River, that was owned by Gren Collins. "But it turned out that Dad was working as a hunting guide, so Mom and us kids had to take care of the guests."

"Dad decided that he really liked being in the lodge business, so we came back to Kenai, and he built a boat on Bernice Lake in Nikiski that he named 'The Katmai.' When we moved across the bay to Iliamna, Dad took the boat, but mother, and us four kids, a nanny goat with twins, a billy goat, and the Jeep, went aboard the fish tender."

Janice recalls that "Mom had made us new clothes and bonnets for Easter and put the bonnets in a box in the Jeep. Unfortunately, the goats got into the box and chewed up the bonnets." They stayed at the schoolhouse in Pile Bay until her dad arrived when they continued up to Bidarka Bay and he could begin building their log cabin.

During that time they lived on the boat. "We slept in sleeping bags on the floor. Before getting up in the morning, mom would get a nice warm washcloth and hand it to us. We'd wash our face and hands, and she'd fix breakfast. Then we were ready for the day."

She remembers that when they finally moved into the new cabin, the door wasn't finished. "So, we had to have a big, folded tarp that fit right over the door jam and we'd pull it back to go in and out. Wherever we lived in Alaska, Dad always built a log home for us to live in."

How do you check out items from the Kenai Senior Center library located in the Game Room? It's the honor system. There are no check out cards. There are no due dates. When you see a book, DVD, jig-saw puzzle, audio book or Blu-Ray you would like to take with you, just take it. When you are finished, you may bring it back. You have two options for your return. You may return it to the place where you got it, or if it is a book return it to the basket near Kayla Feltman's office. If it is a DVD, Blu-Ray or audio book the return container is near the DVD collection.

If your paperback book belongs in the Adventure, Fantasy, Fiction, Mystery, Romance, Science Fiction or Western section these titles are shelved in alphabetical order by the last name of the author. If your returning book belongs in the Alaska or History section, these books are shelved in no particular order. Audio books have two sections. Fiction audio books are shelved on the top shelf by author and Non-Fiction audio books are shelved by title on the second shelf. Blu-Rays are shelved alphabetically by title just as DVDs are.

The kids were home schooled while the family lived in Bidarki Bay. When the family moved across the lake to the town of Iliamna, the three younger siblings went to the New Halen School, while Janice continued home schooling as she was now n the 9th grade. The next year, when her sister Judith was in the 9th grade, she and Janice stayed in Homer with friends for one year, to attend the Homer High School. The next year, they both attended the Copper Valley Catholic Boarding School in Glennallen.

For her senior year they moved back to the homestead north of Kenai, and Janice attended Kenai High School and graduated in 1961. She was president of the pep club. "I had a part time job after school at Leo T. Obert's Insurance Company. I could walk to work, and a friend would pick me up after work and take me home."

One day at work changed the rest of her life. It was Valentine's Day when her boss introduced her to a young man from Canada who was working on an oil rig out Swanson River in Sterling. A couple of weeks later, the young man showed up for a high school basketball game. "We recognized each other and chatted a bit," she recalled.

The next time Janice saw him was at church. "He waited for me after mass, and we chatted a bit and then he asked me if I'd like to go for a coffee. And that was my first date with Duncan Wilsack."

As it turned out, neither of them drank coffee, Duncan drank tea. After their date, he had to drive Janice ten miles north to her home. "And when I went to introduce him to my mother, I couldn't remember his name. Anyway, that was the beginning of our relationship."

Dating in those days was a challenge. Janice recalls that Duncan lived down Swanson River Road in Sterling. "There weren't any phones. Duncan would have to drive all the way from Swanson River Road into Soldotna, then through Kenai and farther north for ten miles to get to my house each time we went on a date. None of the roads were paved, they were all dirt roads, so dating took a little planning. To go to a movie, Duncan had to drive all the way to my house, then we'd drive to Soldotna to the movie theatre, then back out to the homestead, and then Duncan would drive all the way back to Sterling."

The planning paid off and on March 3, 1962, Janice married Duncan Wilsack. They had five daughters: Teresa, Kathleen, Deborah, Brenda, and Jolanda.

"Duncan," she said "was always a great provider, and he hunted and fished. We ordered our clothes from Sears Roebuck and life was very low-key. We also ordered a home from a catalog out of Bay City, Michigan. It was built on one acre of my parent's homestead."

When the children were out of school, Janice worked at Fred Braun's Sporting Goods and for Ron Malston as an engraver, and then for Audrey Johnson at Nikiski Post Office for eight years. When Duncan was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease and Alzheimer's, she became his caregiver. He died in 2004 after forty-two years of marriage.

In 2015, Janice sold her home on the homestead to the Nikiski LNG Plant and moved to Kenai in Inlet Woods Subdivision. After living in her new home for 5 years, she decided it was just too big. Because she'd been a caregiver for her mother and another individual for eight years, she was familiar with Vintage Pointe Manor. She put her name on the waiting list. "It was right at the end of COVID," she said, "and five apartments became available, including the one my mother had lived in. I took it and my house sold in nothing flat. I just felt blessed."

Janice is a member of Abundant Life Assembly in Sterling. "I love it there," she said. "Our primary mission is to live the Gospel message by putting the love of Jesus on display. We want to show the world that God loves and values people."

There's another blessing for Janice on Sundays. Before church, she drives to her daughter Teresa's home in Soldotna. Then four generations; Janice, her daughter Teresa and Teresa's husband John, her granddaughter Carri and her great-grandchildren Eli and Joella all attend the same church together.

Janice's daily routine begins with Bible and devotional readings. She takes part in a Bible study group on Tuesday evening at Vintage Pointe, where she lives, and on Thursday mornings in Nikiski at The Compass. "I do this because it's so wonderful to learn about Jesus," she said. "It's wonderful to be with others who believe the same way. We all go to different churches, but we still believe the same way."

Janice is also active in several groups through the Kenai Senior Center including TOPS

(Take Off Pounds Sensibly), the choir, the Widow and Widower's group, and the Caregiver's group. "Even though Duncan has been gone for twenty-one years, there are others who've lost their spouse recently. In the Widow and Widower's group and the Caregiver's group, I'm not there just for myself. It's a time that we can come together and draw strength and support from each other."



Janice emphasizes that her life has been low key, calm and peaceful. Her apartment reflects that sense of peace and calm. She has an extensive collection of unique and beautiful crosses that reflect her faith. "I've only purchased a few as people continue to bless me with them" she said. She also has a smaller collection of angels and Willow porcelain dolls, and every one was a gift.

Janice is thankful for the blessings in her life. "I'm so blessed living here at Vintage Pointe Manor. And I'm blessed living near my children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren." She says that her ministry is to share with people that Jesus loves them. "When I share that Jesus loves them, most people say that they know that and that He loves me too. And then, sometimes, someone will say that they really needed to hear that."



Alaska Department of Health Division of Public Assistance

Overview

The Senior Benefits Program pays cash benefits to Alaskan seniors who are aged 65 or older and have low to moderate income. Cash payments are \$125, \$175, or \$250 each month depending on other income. The income limits for each payment level are tied to the Alaska Federal Poverty Guidelines and change each year as the poverty level changes.

Who qualifies?

To be eligible for Senior Benefits, an individual must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be age 65 or older
- Be an Alaskan resident
- Be a U.S. citizen or Qualified Alien
- Have a Social Security Number or proof that one has been applied for
- Have countable income that does not exceed the income limits.

Resources, such as savings, do not count for Senior Benefits.


