Know your Neighbor: Hoa Le, A life of Strength, Sacrifice, and Service

This is a story of a remarkable woman who was born at midnight while a white orchid cactus bloomed with radiant beauty. Her parents name her Tan Hoa, which means "Midnight Queen", and she became known simply as Hoa.

Petite and elegant, Hoa seemed to radiate warmth and energy, like the Duracell battery operated rabbit on the TV commercial, 'going, going, going...'. She came from a father was a provincial chief

prosperous family—her father was a provincial chief who owned vast rice fields along the Pacific, with beaches lined by coconut and fruit trees. Raised in comfort, she focused on her studies, earning a degree in chemistry and a master's in pharmacology.

But her charmed life changed overnight when the Communists took power. Her family, deemed "landowners," were labeled enemies of the people. Their property was seized, and they were forced from their home. At three months pregnant, and with her husband imprisoned in a reeducation camp, Hoa became homeless.

Her mother found work in a Catholic convent kitchen, where Hoa took refuge thanks to her grandaunt, a nun. After a few months, she moved in with her husband's distant aunt in the countryside, where she gave birth to her son—healthy, though unable to tolerate her milk. They scraped by, feeding him sweetened rice soup in place of costly formula.

When her husband was released, they began planning their escape. Hoa's father, already safely in the U.S., had used his business skills and multilingual fluency to settle and help other relatives immigrate. But Hoa and her husband had to fend for themselves.

Escaping the country was treacherous. The underground routes were secretive and disorganized. To secure a spot on a boat, they needed 100 ounces of gold—\$30,000 per attempt. From 1978 to 1979, they made six failed attempts due to betrayal or arrests. Finally, on their seventh try, they set sail under the guise of a fishing crew.

Crammed among sixty others in the hidden hold of a boat, they endured days at sea in silence until they reached Malaysian shores. From there, they were taken to a refugee camp, where they waited to be assigned a host country. Thanks to her father's sponsorship, they made it to the United States, landing first in St. Louis before relocating to Texas.



Funding these desperate journeys took the collective support of Hoa's entire extended family in America. Her parents, siblings, and relatives worked long hours in restaurants and odd jobs to raise the funds. Grateful beyond words, Hoa vowed to repay their kindness.

She wasted no time rebuilding her life. She returned to school, earning a pharmacology degree and later certified as a registered pharmacist. For over three decades, she juggled two jobs—often spending her vacation time working additional shifts—all to repay the debt of love her family had extended.

As her relatives aged, many lacked retirement savings, having spent their lives helping others. Hoa and her husband took on the responsibility of caring for them. They provided housing and financial support through their twilight years. Her son joined in, helping his mother support those who once supported her.

When the COVID-19 pandemic struck in 2020, Hoa retired to care for her three grandchildren. From tending to her elders to nurturing the next generation, her selflessness never wavered.

These days, Hoa splits her time between feeding people and feeding her garden. True to her word, she spends her money on food and plants. At Vintage Pointe and the Kenai Senior Center, she's known for her delicious dishes and the vibrant flower beds she lovingly maintains. With her knitted green cap and endless energy, she's often spotted cleaning the grounds, pulling weeds, and nurturing blooms—still giving beauty and care, just like the night she was born.

Hoa's unwavering perseverance, generous heart, and selfless spirit continue to inspire everyone around her. She is a living testament to the guiet power of resilience, and the legacy of love.

Kenai Senior Connection, Inc. Five Dollar Club

Several people have asked me recently just what the Five Dollar A Month Club is, and what it is for. I'll address that here and will do further research for a more extensive article at a future date.

Since the Kenai Senior Center is a city-owned building and service, it is not volunteer run like other Senior Centers on the Peninsula. Don't get me wrong, they use plenty of volunteers, but the main staff are city employees and the Center is city funded, so there's no 'membership' per se required. The Senior Connection (a fund-raising board that supports the Senior Center), is entirely volunteer run, so we can require 'membership fees', which we do so through the Five Dollar A Month Club. Contributors to this fund can become members of the Senior Connection Board, and their contributions go directly to Senior Connection. Membership on this Board also makes the Member eligible to sit as a Member or Officer.

We are currently four Members shy of our allotted fifteen board members; here's your opportunity: You've already taken a step to show your support by contributing to the club, why not go one step further and apply for a position on Senior Connection? Application forms are available from any board member (names in the Senior Connections article) or available at the front desk.



Alaska Department of Health Division of Public Assistance

Overview

The Senior Benefits Program pays cash benefits to Alaskan seniors who are aged 65 or older and have low to moderate income. Cash payments are \$125, \$175, or \$250 each month depending on other income. The income limits for each payment level are tied to the Alaska Federal Poverty Guidelines and change each year as the poverty level changes.

Who qualifies?

To be eligible for Senior Benefits, an individual must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be age 65 or older
- Be an Alaskan resident
- Be a U.S. citizen or Qualified Alien
- Have a Social Security Number or proof that one has been applied for
- Have countable income that does not exceed the income limits.

Resources, such as savings, do not count for Senior Benefits.




